The Project Statement below has been selected by the Safe Skies Oversight Committee and will be the starting point for a panel of experts to develop a Request for Proposals (RFP). The RFP is expected to be available in early 2025.

Effective security related training for aviation workers reaches beyond simply ensuring training is accomplished when a worker is hired at an airport. Airport security vulnerabilities can develop if new personnel are under-trained on essential information or over-trained with information not related to job duties or environment. In addition, individual workers have diverse backgrounds, learning styles, and levels of previous experience, which complicates development of training content and delivery methods.

The objective of this research is to assist airport operators in optimizing security related training for aviation workers.
